educating orphans of different countries. When she is not at school, you'll find Mrs. Adams on her WII game system perfecting her Tiger Wood's Golf Game.







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School Day Tips and Reminders

As we start again into our school year after our fun-filled summer breaks, here area few tips and reminders for school day success:

- Please be safe and courteous at drop-off and pick-up times. Remember that left-hand traffic lane is for through traffic. Cars should stop and drop-off students on the school side lane only. Please be aware that there are two pedestrian crossing zones on Wyco Drive and a single pedestrian cross zone in front of the kindergarten classes.
- Students may be dropped off no earlier than 7:25a.m. The building doors will open at 7:35 a.m. Classes begin promptly at 7:45 a.m. and tardy slips will be given at the conclusion of the final morning bell.
- Please conduct communications with the front office through the sign-in window. All visitors and volunteers should sign-in and out on the visitor logs and have identification available for scanning into our security system.
- ALL school payments including field trip money, lunch money, etc. should be sent in a sealed enveloped with the students name, dollar amount, teacher name and reason (i.e. "Lunch Money") clearly written on the front. Please have your child give these payments to his/her classroom teacher.
- If you need to get anything to your student after the start of the school day, please bring it to the front office and a staff member will deliver the item to minimize instruction interruption.
- If your child is ill, please contact the school via the attendance line (720-972-5400 option #1) by 9:00 a.m. the morning of the absence. Please leave the students name, teacher, grade & reason for absence.
- It is imperative that you pick-up your child as promptly as possible and no later than 15 minutes after the conclusion of the school day. With BASE enrollment to maximum capacities this year with our increased numbers, we do not have this option available. Please be aware that RTD has 2 green buses that are available to Hulstrom students providing both a Northglenn/Thornton as well as a Brighton route.
